Biographical Sketch

Robert L. Lamborn was McDonogh School's eighth Headmaster, serving from 1952 to 1971. He succeeded his father, Louis E. Lamborn, who served as Headmaster from 1925 to 1952. After graduating McDonogh in 1935, he attended Stanford University, receiving an A.B. in Philosophy in 1938, an Ed.M. in Secondary School Administration from Harvard University in 1941, and an Ed. D. in Personal Adjustment and Guidance from Johns Hopkins University in 1951.

In 1943, while serving as Assistant Headmaster, he enlisted in the anti-aircraft artillery, and entered the Army as a private. He was assigned to the Ordnance Unit Department's Red River Ordnance Training Center, where he served as a training instructor, information and education officer, and a post-map-reading specialist, among other positions, until he was relieved of active duty in March of 1946 as a First Lieutenant.

Upon returning to McDonogh, Lamborn resumed his previous position of Assistant Headmaster, as well as taking on the additional role as Head of the Upper School. In 1952, he was appointed to the position of Headmaster by the Board of Trustees and served in that capacity until his retirement in 1973. Among the many accomplishments during his tenure, he is most noted for shepherding the school through racial integration, as well as its transition from a military to civilian program. He is also recognized for helping to pave the way for the admission of female students.

Post-McDonogh, Lamborn continued his work in the field of secondary education. He was Executive Director of the Council for American Private Education (CAPE), from 1973 to 1980, was an educational consultant specializing in private school management, and was on the faculty of UCLA's Graduate School of Education, between 1980 and 1986. Afterward, Lamborn, along with his wife, Barbara Blaes Lamborn, provided consulting services on matters related to long distance cycling touring - an avid hobby of theirs - as well as modeling for print, film, television, and motion pictures. He passed away on February 11, 2021, at the age of 102.

Scope and Content Notes

This collection consists of 13 boxes of the personal papers of Robert L. Lamborn and includes materials from Lamborn's time as a young student at McDonogh, his college and university career, his service during World War II, his time as an administrator at McDonogh, professional pursuits post-McDonogh, and retirement activities.

Series Description

The Robert L. Series 1: Biographical & Family contains biographical information about Lamborn and his family, but the bulk of the Series consists of personal correspondence between Robert and his father, Louis “Doc” Lamborn spanning the years 1929 – 1969.

Series 2: Military Service mostly contains Lamborn’s official military paperwork and correspondence, (1943 – 1946); an *Administrative Check List: May 1945...*, and *A Report on Evaluation in Ordinance...* (1946) with two appendices.

Series 3: Education Sub-Series A: Secondary Education (1924 – 1935) contains tests, exams, grade reports, and other misc. from Lamborn’s time as a student at McDonogh. **Education Sub-Series B through G** is comprised mostly of course work, research papers, and correspondence related to his time as a student at various universities. The bulk of correspondence in **Box 7, (1934 – 1949)** is between Louis Lamborn and institutions of higher education on behalf of his son, Robert Lamborn regarding his education, as well as correspondence between Robert and his father regarding his studies, etc., and some other miscellaneous.

Series 4: Phi Delta Kappa consists predominantly of issues of the *Alpha Rho Bulletin* (1947 – 1954), and some misc. correspondence regarding Alpha Rho Chapter business.

Series 5: Educational Consulting consists of **Sub-Series A: CAPE (1973- 1979)** consists of papers and correspondence during Lamborn’s time as CAPE’s executive director, and **Sub-Series B: UCLA (1982 - 1986)**

Series 6: Retirement: Sub-Series A: Pedal for Power (1990-1991) consists of correspondence, related to the Lamborn’s cross-country “Pedal for Power” fundraising cycling trips, as well as other cycling tours throughout the northeast and Mid-Atlantic. **Sub-Series B: McDonogh School** includes mostly correspondence between Lamborn and McDonogh faculty and staff (1972 – 2017 w/gaps), and short essays about some of his boyhood experiences growing up on McDonogh campus.
